"That's the defense argument she has to make, which is that she was speaking in one pitch about optimistic projections and expectations, but that the government is claiming she was speaking in a different pitch about the present," Roth says. Professor Kathryn Miller Comments in Bloomberg about Cross Examinations in the Maxwell Trial

"The confrontational process of cross-examination can be seen by the jury as re-traumatizing or blaming the victim, particularly when defense counsel is male and the victim is female," says Miller. "Defense teams will often elect to have a female member cross-examine alleged sexual abuse victims to diminish these concerns. Seeing a female team member express doubt about the witness's story gives the jury permission to do the same."
