<u>Professor Jessica Roth</u> was a guest on Bloomberg Radio, where she spoke about the impeachment trial in the Senate: "The President's lawyers so far seem to be primarily attacking the process...in addition, they are arguing that even if one were to accept the facts, as alleged by the House managers, there's nothing wrong there."
