Polk Wagner ([@ProfPolkWagner](#)) focuses his research and teaching in intellectual property law and policy, with a special interest in patent law.



He has written over 20 articles ([see them here](#)) on topics ranging from an empirical analysis of judicial decision-making in patent law to the First Amendment status of software programs. His work has appeared in the Stanford Law Review, Columbia Law Review, and the University of Pennsylvania Law Review, among several others. He is the author (with Professor Craig Nard) of Patent Law: Concepts and Insights (Foundation Press 2008).
