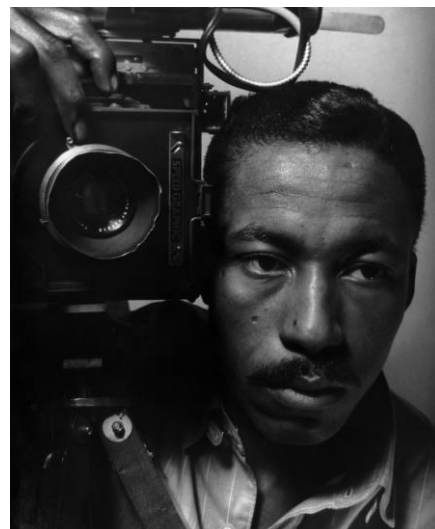

## Video: Cardozo's Patent Diversity Project Secures Patent on Behalf of Black Female Inventor

Cardozo's [Patent Diversity Project](#), led by Director [Victor Wang '15](#), has secured its first patent on behalf of Rose Coppee, a Black inventor, for a modular hairbrush.

Funded in part by Google, the Patent Diversity Project aims to close the “patent gap” by providing free legal assistance to inventors who have been historically underrepresented, including women and people of color.
