

He is editor of Colors of Confinement: Rare Kodachrome Photographs of Japanese American Incarceration in World War II and author of Free to Die for Their Country: The Story of the Japanese American Draft Resisters in World War II.

Previously she was a federal prosecutor in the United States Attorney's Office for the Southern District of New York.
