In *Ashcroft v. Iqbal*, Muslim, Arab, and South Asian plaintiffs claimed that they were subjected to systemic abuse while held in federal detention in the aftermath of the September 11th attacks. On May 18, 2009, the Supreme Court announced its decision in the case, ruling 5-4 that the plaintiffs had not adequately alleged a claim

of unconstitutional discrimination against Attorney General John Ashcroft and FBI Director Robert Mueller.

Iqbal's influence on pleading doctrine and practice has been debated ever since. Ten years after the decision, it has been cited in more than 180,000 court opinions and 2,000 law review articles, making it one of the most cited opinions in the history of the Supreme Court.

We are pleased to host an all-day symposium at Cardozo Law School on March 15, 2019, reflecting on Iqbal's impact on both procedural and substantive law.

An esteemed group of experts, including lawyers who argued both sides of the Iqbal case, will examine the decision's influence, with a keynote by Arthur R. Miller, the nation's leading scholar in the field of civil procedure.
