PROFESSOR MICHEL ROSENFELD LECTURES ON HATE SPEECH

March 3, 2017

Professor Michel Rosenfeld, University Professor of Law and Comparative Democracy, was a featured speaker Wednesday, March 1 at a conference sponsored by the American Jewish Committee, held at the law firm Paul, Weiss, Rifkind, Wharton & Garrison, LLP in New York City.

The conference focused on criminal hate speech in the U.S. and Europe, a field of scholarship that Rosenfeld has written about and lectured on extensively.

Rosenfeld is the director of the Program on Global and Comparative Constitutional Theory at Cardozo Law. His talk was titled “U.S. First Amendment Tradition on Hate Speech.”

“It has become pressing to determine whether the United States’ permissive attitude toward hate speech is still preferable to its more restrictive European counterpart in light of the present increase in xenophobia and surge in anti-Semitism,” said Professor Rosenfeld.
