PROFESSOR KYRON HUIGENS WRITES OP-ED IN OBSERVER

Professor Kyron Huigens focused on the problems with the Electoral College, writing in the *Observer*, "The greater power of small states' voters is sometimes defended on the ground that these states have unique interests because of their agricultural economies. But agriculture is a major part of the economies of California, New York, Illinois, Florida and Texas. Another defense—the claim that the 'Heartland' values of these citizens deserve greater representation—is completely indefensible in a democracy. Rural citizens are not more American than urban citizens."
