After the revolution of 1959, the Castro government nationalized assets and artwork owned by private citizens. The expropriation of what is estimated today to be \$7 billion in U.S. citizens'

assets resulted in almost six decades of severe retaliatory sanctions from the U.S. Although the pending normalization of relations between the U.S. and Cuba should extend to the art market, this will raise thorny questions concerning the provenance and title of art that may have been confiscated.

Are there precedents to guide us? How will sanctions be impacted under this new administration? And how do we prepare clients to claim their looted works?

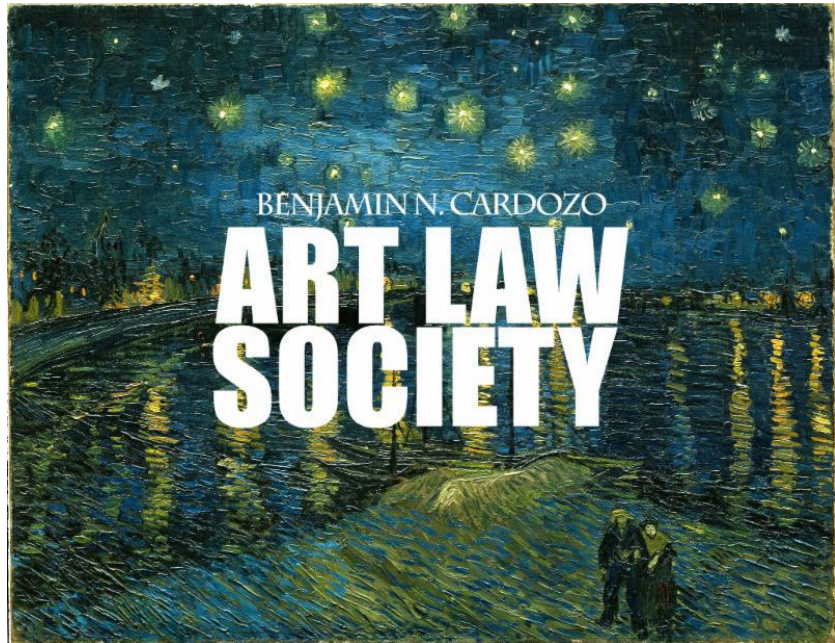
