City Agrees to Pay Rikers Inmates Who Were Forced Back Into Solitary Confinement; Professor Reinert Represented Plaintiffs in Class Action Suit

Between 2012 and 2015, a Rikers Island policy mandated that if a prisoner who was in solitary confinement before they were released was returned to jail, the prisoner would be forced back into solitary no matter how much time had passed. Professor Alexander Reinert is one of the attorneys representing a group of plaintiffs affected by the policy who filed a class action lawsuit against New York City.
