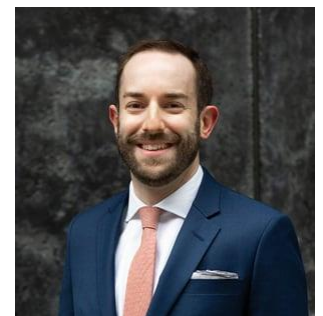
Professor Kate Levine, in Axios Interview, Discusses Murder Charges Against Police Officers
