**Future of Native American Mascots in Sports**  
September 15, 2020, at 6PM

This discussion will address the past, present, and future of Native American mascots in sports.

The recent announcement that Washington's NFL team would drop its mascot is the culmination of years of efforts by activists and scholars to bring about a change. But the change only came once

Washington's corporate sponsors decided the time was right. This discussion will address the past, present, and future of Native American mascots in sports. It will draw on insights from Native American scholars, international human rights, and intellectual property law.

Panelists:

Natalie Welch: Professor Welch teaches Sports Marketing at Linfield University. She is a member of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians, and her research focuses on the positives of sport in Native communities and how Native communities can use sports as a path to success. Professor Welch specializes in Sports Management and has worked with the TIDES Institute on Racial and Gender Report Cards, Disney/ESPN Wide World of Sports, Nike's Native American N7 initiative, and Wieden+Kennedy. She also hosts the "Creative Native" podcast.

Jocelyn Getgen Kestenbaum: Professor Getgen Kestenbaum directs Cardozo's Benjamin B. Ferencz Human Rights and Atrocity Prevention Clinic and the Cardozo Law Institute in Holocaust and Human Rights (CLIHHR). Previously, she worked as program director of Virtue Foundation, a nonprofit implementing rights-based sustainable development projects in health, education, justice, and women's empowerment globally. Professor Getgen Kestenbaum also directs CLIHHR's *Confronting Structural Violence: Law Teaching Guides* Project which provides open access teaching guides that explore how U.S. law has perpetuated structural and identity-based violence. Additionally, she teaches an *Indigenous Rights in the Americas* course.

Christopher Buccafusco: Professor Buccafusco is the Director of Cardozo's Intellectual Property and Information Law Program as well as the Associate Dean for Faculty Development. His research covers a wide range of topics and methods related to creativity, innovation, and intellectual property law. Professor Buccafusco uses novel social science experiments to explore the nature of innovation markets, and he writes about evolving issues in copyright, patent, and trademark law, including music copyright litigation, pharmaceutical patents, and protection for industrial design.

**Online Platform Liability 10 Years After *Tiffany v. eBay*  
Wednesday, September 16 at 6:30 p.m.**

Join the Fashion Law Society, the Intellectual Property Law Society, and the Alumni Association's Retail & Luxury Practice Group to celebrate the 10th anniversary of *Tiffany v. eBay*, a case that is one of trademark law's most significant decisions of the past decade. Ten years later, secondary liability for trademark infringement continues to be a point of tension between trademark owners and e-commerce platforms. This panel invites attorneys who represented both sides in the seminal case, as well as amicus brief writers, to revisit the decision and reflect on the development of the secondary liability doctrine over the past ten years. The panel concludes with a discussion of the recently proposed bi-partisan SHOP SAFE act legislation that aims to provide additional protection to trademark owners.
