Clement Lee '11 is a supervising attorney for the Sex Workers Project at the Urban Justice Center and the Central American Refugee Center (CARECEN). He represents immigrant survivors of human trafficking including transgender immigrant women and Central American parents with children fleeing gender-based, domestic and transnational criminal/gang violence. Prior to this, Clement worked for Make the Road New York helping undocumented immigrants and DACA recipients and Immigration Equality representing detained LGBT and HIV positive immigrants in removal proceedings and applications for asylum. He has been a Tom Steel Legal Fellow and was a recipient of the 2016 LGBT Bar Association's "Best 40 LGBT Lawyers under 40" Award.

The Gates Award is presented in honor of the late Professor E. Nathaniel Gates, who served as a member of faculty from 1991 to 2006. Professor Gates was an avid scholar of constitutional and American legal history, and actively participated in the school's diversity coalition. He is remembered as an inspirational professor and mentor. OUTLaw presents an award in his name to a Cardozo alumnus or alumna who exemplifies his spirit and displays a commitment to advancing LGBT rights.
