Three Steps Forward, Two Steps Back: The Quagmire of Citizenship in India

Monday, October 26. 12:00PM-1:00PM ET

India's Register of Citizens (NRC) lays out a strategy that effectively singles out and expels religious minority communities. Because of these processes, over 1.9 million people currently stand to lose rights, protections, and nationality. Effectively, this process is the largest disenfranchisement exercise in recent human history. The UN Office Of The High Commissioner For Human Rights and other civil rights defenders already have sounded the alarm, identifying clear and unsettling parallels to historical incidents of government-led mass exclusion, persecution, and erasure of populations.

Join Ramya Jawahar Kudekallu (Benjamin N. Cardozo School of Law), Padmini Baruah (Justice and Liberty Initiative) and Darshana Mitra (Parichay) for a conversation on India's complicated history with immigration in the state of Assam and the country's current directives against people from ethno-religious minority communities.

Padmini Baruah (they/them) is a graduate student at the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy, and a member of the Justice and Liberty Initiative, a Guwahati-based human rights group that advocates for the rights of those whose citizenship is under threat in Assam. Their research focuses

on gender, migration, and statelessness. In the past, they have worked for the Abdul Latif Jameel Poverty Action Lab at MIT, and the Henry J. Leir Institute for Human Security.

Darshana Mitra (she/her) is the co-founder of Parichay, a collaborative legal aid clinic set up to assist persons excluded from the National Register of Citizens in Assam, India. She graduated from the West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences in 2012 and subsequently worked at the Alternative Law Forum, where she focused on issues concerning immigration law, child rights, gender, and sexuality. Darshana is a Fulbright-Nehru Scholar and completed her LL.M at Columbia Law School as the Human Rights Fellow at the Human Rights Institute. She currently teaches at West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences.

Ramya Jawahar Kudekallu (she/her) is a Visiting Instructor of Clinic Law and CLIHHR's Telford Taylor Teaching Fellow. Her work focuses on the rights of minorities and atrocity prevention through international intervention. In 2018, Ramya graduated from Fordham School of Law with an LL.M in International Law and Justice. Later that year, she secured the Crowley Fellowship with the Leitner Center for International Law. She's taught a Human Rights Scholarship class and has conducted research on labor, gender-based discrimination and access to justice.

Panel Discussion: Lawyer Discipline and Executive Branch Lawyers

Thursday, October 29 at 4:30 p.m.

The actions of Attorney General William Barr are controversial. Concerns have been expressed that he has violated the DC Rules of Professional Conduct (where he has been admitted). The gravamen of complaints against Barr are (1) that he has engaged in dishonesty or conduct prejudicial to the administration of justice, including by making false statements of fact and law; and (2) he has failed his client – the People of the United States – by preferring the interests of a non-client (President Trump) and/or by using government power to promote partisan political interests. This panel will review both of these possible concerns.

This panel will also explore the prudential arguments for and against using bar discipline as a response to what might be, ultimately, a matter of political disagreement among lawyers about the conduct of one of their own. It will also consider where the lines are, and should be, drawn between

legitimate uses of government prosecutorial power and illegitimate partisan uses, and how DOJ's politicization of its power should be policed, and by whom.
