#### ***The Gloria and Stanley Plesent Lecture***

This symposium will explore the bioethical and legal ethical issues that arise for professionals working with individuals with dementia who engage in behavior potentially detrimental to the health and security of themselves and others.

The symposium will focus on the period before dementia's final stages, addressing the challenges that professionals face when seeking to respect autonomy and self-expression while attending to the safety and well-being of people with dementia.
