

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

Join **Professor Jessica Roth** and **Professor Jocelyn Getgen Kestenbaum** for a conversation with Eric L. Muller, author of the newly released book <u>Lawyer, Jailer, Ally, Foe: Complicity and</u> <u>Conscience in America's World War II Concentration Camps.</u>

**Eric L. Muller** is Dan K. Moore Distinguished Professor in Jurisprudence and Ethics at the University of North Carolina School of Law. He is editor of *Colors of Confinement: Rare Kodachrome Photographs of Japanese American Incarceration in World War II* and author of *Free to Die for Their Country: The Story of the Japanese American Draft Resisters in World War II*.

*Lawyer, Jailer, Ally, Foe* brings to vivid life the stories of three white lawyers, with contradictory instructions — provide legal counsel to the prisoners, but keep the place running — illuminating a shameful episode of American history through imaginative narrative deeply grounded in archival evidence.
