Measures for Justice is a non-profit organization that gathers criminal justice data at the county level and uses it to populate performance measures that address three criminal justice system goals: Public Safety; Fair Process; and Fiscal Responsibility. All of this information will be available for free via a first-of-its kind public Data Portal that allows users to break information down by race/ethnicity; indigent status; sex; age; attorney type; and offense severity.

**Measures for Justice recently received major support from [Google.org](https://www.google.org) and will soon publicly launch the Data Portal with data from six states.**
