Duncan B. Hollis, Professor of Law at Temple Law School, will discuss his work at the intersections of cybersecurity and international law in conversation with Cardozo Professor **Deborah Pearlstein**.

Part of the conversation will be the **Paris Call for Trust and Security**, the first global multi-stakeholder document on cybersecurity. Signed by more than 300 governments and companies such as Microsoft, Google and IBM, this document reflects an emerging consensus on the need for global "cybernorms" to ensure the system remains open, stable and secure.

Paris Call - Fundamental Principles:

- Protecting against indiscriminate/systemic cyber-attacks targeting individuals or civilian infrastructure
- Protecting against attacks that would impact the functioning of the Internet itself
- Protecting against foreign interference with electoral processes
