The biggest death penalty news from the Supreme Court this term involves the case the Court did not decide. On June 29, the Court denied certiorari in *Bourgeois v. Barr*, which clears the way for the Trump administration to resume federal executions—potentially as soon as this Monday, July 13.

In today's Unboxing the Law, Cardozo professor and capital defense attorney, Kathryn Miller, will explain the rulings below, discuss possible reasons for the Court's decision to deny certiorari, and share what the ruling could mean for the future of the death penalty generally.
