## BACKGROUND AND NEXT STEPS

In 2019, New York may become the first state with a separate body to address complaints about the conduct of its prosecutors, after Gov. Cuomo signed a bill authorizing the creation of a Commission on Prosecutorial Conduct on March 27th.
